



Codes of conduct for Parents/Guardians of Child Skaters



Parents are expected to:

- Discourage improper and unfair behaviour setting a good example by your own behaviour at all times.
- Help your child to recognise good team performance, not just results.
- Positively reinforce their child/young person and show an interest in their chosen activity.
- Encourage their child to play by the rules and teach them that they can only do their best
- Support your child’s involvement but never force them to take part in the sport.
- Accept the official’s judgement.
- Respect the rights of other parents and their children.
- Do not take disciplinary measures into your own hands – any issues/complaints should be made in writing to either JNL rink management or the Synchro sub-committee.
- Do not gossip and speculate with others what is happening or will happen within Synchro if not of a positive nature.
- Be aware that public and personal adverse comments or gossip regarding coaches and rink management can result in disciplinary action being taken by both BISC and JNL.
- Do not make complaints without good reason. Opportunist, vexatious or malicious complaints will be treated as harassment.
- Show appreciation and support the coach, manager and committee
- Acknowledge the importance and role of the club coaches who provide their time to ensure children’s participation in the club.
- Understand all decisions regarding teams, team selection, and alternates are made by Synchro Coaches and Synchro Management. Don’t go behind coaches or Synchro committee’s back forming plans of Synchro team. This is the responsibility of coaches and Synchro sub committee.
- Complete and return any form pertaining to their child's participation with Bracknell FUSION Synchro Skating Team in a timely manner
- Deliver and collect the child punctually to and from coaching sessions.
- Ensure their child is properly and adequately attired i.e. training / off-ice kit and that.
- Detail any health concerns pertaining to the child in particular breathing or chest conditions. Any changes in the state of the child's health should be reported to the Synchro manager or chaperone prior to coaching sessions.
- To inform the chaperone prior to departure from the rink if the child is to be collected early from a coaching session.

Parents/Guardians have the right to:

- Know their child is safe
- Be informed of problems or concerns relating to their children
- Be informed if their child is injured
- Complain to the Synchro Team Manager in writing, if they have concerns about the standard of coaching

Any misdemeanours and breach of this code of conduct will be dealt with immediately by a Bracknell FUSION Synchro sub committee. Persistent concerns or breaches will result in the parent/guardian being asked not to attend if their attendance is detrimental to the child’s welfare. The ultimate action should a parent/guardian continue to breach the code of behaviour may mean the Bracknell FUSION Synchro Skating Team officials regrettably asking the child to leave the club.
